WHAT WILL BE COVERED?

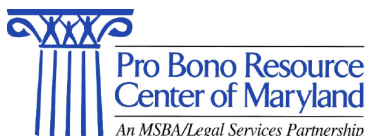
- Helpful hints for establishing rapport and interviewing an unaccompanied child.
