- · Community education
 - Updates on current immigration law and policies
 - · Know your rights
- Screening
- · Family emergency planning
- Advocacy
- Quality referrals

Organizing Community Events

- Anyone in the community can organize an event
- Needs assessment
- Planning
 - · Location, timing, speakers, materials
- · Day-Of Details
 - · Roles, materials, set-up

Needs Assessment and Planning

- Who lives in your community and what information do they need?
 - KYR, screening, family emergency planning
- Planning logistics
 - Location
 - Ensure expert speakers and service providers
 - · Outreach is crucial

Event Details

- Who are your partners?
- · What is everyone's role?
- · How many people are you expecting?
- Logistics:
 - · Space, materials, food
 - · Accessibility (including language capacity)

Demand for Know Your Rights (KYR) Presentations

- Since late January of 2017, Catholic Charities of Arlington has received dozens of requests for KYR presentations
 - Limited staff, who was busy with legal consultations and casework
 - Cadre of over 800 active volunteers that help with other components of our program

Demand for Know Your Rights (KYR) Presentations (Cont'd)

- Volunteer Train the Trainer KYR training for pro bono attorneys and non-attorney volunteers set up in March to respond to the requests:
 - Had 51 people get trained in first training
 - Equipped all volunteers with PowerPoint and materials in English and Spanish
 - Gave 24 KYR presentations as a result, all volunteer-run. All presentations scheduled through our office to control venue/logistics.

Tips for Recruiting Volunteers

- Reach out to your current volunteer pool (ESOL teachers, food pantry volunteers, etc.)
- Reach out to your agency-wide staff (social workers, bilingual staff, etc.)
- Target any volunteers who are bilingual
- Reach out to organizations who are requesting KYR presentations to recruit volunteers
- Partner with other organizations that want to be trained (L4GG, public schools, etc.)

Training Tips

- Provide all materials (handouts, Powerpoint presentation) to trainees so that an internet connection is not needed (ex: basement of a church that doesn't have Wifi is not going to help if you have to show a YouTube video).
- Volunteers can use their own laptops this way.
- Manage the logistics/venue of KYR presentations inhouse.
 - Only provide KYR presentations at a church or school (designated "safe space")
 - Know the motive and audience of those that are requesting the presentation

Training Tips

- Make sure the venue can provide a speaker system/projector.
- · Advertise for KYR trainings in-house
 - o Consistency in the flyer and the message/logo
 - Direct all questions about training back to your office
 - Don't want questions directed at the venue itself
 - Don't want volunteer trainers fielding questions about the training from their personal phones

Training Tips

- Educate on the difference between legal advice and legal education.
- Make sure to stress that NO legal advice be given:
 - Unauthorized practice of law if non-attorney is doing the training
 - Pro bono attorney trainers might not be specialized in immigration law
 - Not the appropriate forum for personal legal questions or consultations

Training Tips

- Provide trainers with the Powerpoint handout that clients will see.
- Add speaker notes for each slide, so they can present slide by slide and refer to talking points helow
- Add in the most FAQs that your staff who has given KYR presentations encounter, so that volunteer trainers are prepared for as many questions as possible.

Example of Speaker Notes/FAQs

NOTE: Important to stress that these are different situations in which individuals may "encounter" ICE/law enforcement.

FAQs:

- 1. What does a warrant look like?
 - · Refer to sample warrant in KYR packet.
- 2. What are the minimum requirements of a warrant?
 - It must be signed by a judge, justice of the peace, or magistrate
 - It must state the complete address to be searched
 - It must state in detail the area to be searched
 - It has to be current (make sure it is not expired)
- 3. What if they enter with force or because they have a warrant, what can I do?
 - Observe where the officers search
 - If they take property, you can ask for a receipt
 - Take note if they search beyond the scope of the warrant

Example of Speaker Notes/FAQs (Cont'd)

- 4. What documents will ICE ask you to sign?
 - You do not need to sign any documents before having the chance to have an attorney review them
- 5. What if the warrant does not fit under the door?
 - •Ask them to see if they will place it at the door and step (far) back, OR •Ask if they will slide it through a window
- 6. Should I try to leave/escape?
 - •If you are caught outside the home, they do not need a warrant
 - •Running could be interpreted as an admission of guilt
 - •You may risk escalating the issue further (i.e. giving them reason to believe they now must enter the home due to an emergency/unsafe environment, etc.)
