

With an attorney, detained immigrants are FOUR TIMES MORE LIKELY to be released on bond. Your help is needed more than ever.

HOW IT WORKS

STEP 1: Sign up for any 3-month period during which you commit to representing at least 1 immigrant at his/her bond hearing. That is the extent of your pro bono commitment.

STEP 2: Complete our new comprehensive online bond course. This e-course is designed specifically to support our remote bond project and is accompanied by a full toolkit of materials, including templates and practice guides that walk you through the process.

STEP 3: Choose a case. After completing the training, you will receive alerts about cases in need of representation. Once you are matched with a matter, you can do all of your work remotely, which may include: speaking with the client by phone, gathering evidence and statements from the client's friends and family, preparing a bond motion, and appearing telephonically before the relevant immigration court for the bond hearing itself. The local legal service provider can visit the client in person at the detention center to get documents signed. Plus, you will be mentored by an experienced attorney dedicated to this work.
